

Cattle Herd Health

Many factors go into a herd health program for cattle. These include geographic location, number of animals, stocking density, and whether the herd is open or closed. This is only an outline and can be modified to fit any individual herd's characteristics.

Basic Herd concept of exposing bulls on December 15th, and pulling bulls on March 1st.

*Many vaccines require booster shots at 4-6 week interval if primary immunization. Other vaccines may be added to customize herd health program such as Pink-eye vaccine.

***Ivomec Plus may be used in place of Panacur/Curatrem but is less affective against flukes.
